NH Saves Button Up Workshop Hosted by The Town of Carroll Energy Commission

When: Tuesday March 31

Time: 6:00 pm – 7:30 pm

NHSaves Button Up, the popular home energy savings workshop series, is coming to Twin Mountain. The Town of Carroll Energy Commission is presenting this free workshop for residents.

If you are unable to attend in person this is also available via Zoom. To get the Zoom link email energycommission@carrollnh.gov

The workshop is sponsored by NHSaves and coordinated statewide by the Plymouth Area Renewable Energy Initiative (PAREI).

NHSaves is a collaboration of New Hampshire's electric and natural gas utilities (Eversource, Liberty Utilities, NH Electric Cooperative and Unitil). The utilities are working together to provide NH customers with information, incentives, and support designed to save energy, reduce costs, and protect the NH environment. PAREI of Plymouth, NH is working with local groups around the state to bring these workshops to the public on behalf of New Hampshire's utilities.

The NHSaves Button Up Workshop is a 1.5-hour presentation plus Q&A about how to improve the energy efficiency of your home. It is conducted by a certified energy auditor and covers basic building science principles as well as examples of whole house weatherization measures that will button up your home for the heating and cooling seasons. It also covers details about the energy efficiency programs offered by NH utilities (for existing homes and new construction) that provide energy audits, weatherization measures such as air sealing and insulating, and rebates on new technologies and products such as electric and gas appliances and high efficiency electric heating/cooling equipment.

NH residents wishing to use energy more efficiently, conserve energy and save money on their heating and cooling bills, will find the workshop presentation very helpful. From the local workshop organizer, the Carroll Energy Commission, "We are bringing this workshop to Twin Mountain because it offers valuable and practical information about how to save energy and reduce costs while making our homes more comfortable. The information about available funding can also help make these improvements possible for more people. With the high cost of energy, efficiency is now more important than ever. We hope many people will take the time to attend this informative workshop."

TOWN OF CARROLL FOOD PANTRY

Just a reminder that there is a food pantry in town for those that may be having a tough time for a while or if we can help you with some extra food. It is in the town hall and is open Monday through Thursday's when the Offices are open. Feel free to stop in ask, and if you know someone that could use it please let them know to stop in as well.

THE CASELLA RUMOR UPDATE

In the winter newsletter I had put quite a bit of information about the Casella Company looking to put in a Transfer Station over on Rte. 3 North across from UPS. I will start by saying how happy I am to see people speaking out and getting their voices heard, as it should be. We have not heard anything new from Casella, they have not put in any requests to speak to or go before the Planning or Zoning Boards, nor return to the Selectboard. I have spoken to quite a few residents and property owners about all this

and there is a petition about this as well. There is a group on Facebook called North Country Alliance for Balanced Change, which is posting information and helping with their knowledge.

I will also add part of a letter in favor of this coming in, it is not that I agree but this is a free country, so we will let this be posted at well.

Letter from Jules Marquis: There has been a lot of talk about the proposed Casella transfer station and just as much conflicting information. I decided to do a little information gathering and get as much factual material as I could. I got ahold of Marc Morgan who works for Casella and is in charge of the project. I questioned him to get the facts about the Proposed transfer station. Transfer stations have to be licensed to limit the tonnage that the station can process. This station is going to be licensed to receive between 100 & 200 tons a day. One hundred tons translates to roughly 30 loads from the trucks that gather from the business Casella services in the area. Those trucks are the ones that pick up the dumpsters like I have my Campground, not tractor trailers. Those 30 loads translate to about 10 tractor trailer loads leaving the station. The 200-ton license would double these numbers. This station would accommodate three types of trash.

One key point is that anything that comes in each day must be in a trailer at the end of every day. By law the floor must be empty at the end of every day; they will be cycling all the material at a quick pace preventing trash from getting a strong odor. Our campground has two dumpsters in the yard every day of the year and the only time we can say we get a slight smell is if the dumpsters have been setting in the yard for more than a week with very high temperatures, the transfer station trash is like I said cycled every day. There are benefits to the town such as tax revenue.

KEEPING YOU IN THE LOOP

In 2025 we voted to put a Short-Term Rental policy into effect. It had started out as a registration and inspection but during the Deliberative Session it was changed. Some felt

that the town would be sued for requiring the owners of the Airbnb to be required to do this, so was changed, as that is what the public wanted and voted for.

After the election we wrote a letter and a registration form and mailed them out to the 287 rentals that we had found online for renting and etc. Well, out of the 287 we received 81 that sent back in the registration, 106 that wrote or called and said they didn't rent out, and 100 with NO RESPONSE even after sending out 2 notices. It amazes me that these people expect that we are going to believe that there are only 81 rentals in Twin Mt. and Bretton Woods!!!!

The Town of Lincoln has a registration for all the ones they have and are charging \$100.00, Jefferson also requires a permit as well, amazing that we don't charge, and they still can't be honest enough to send us the needed information in case of emergency. I want to remind you that many or most of these "rentals" are listed under an LLC, so the town has no way of contacting the owner or management company in case of emergency. At some point there will be less and less lawsuits when a town wants to register all these "businesses", but until that if you see something wrong or to many people know that the town is trying, and if it gets too bad, please be sure to contact the Police Department.

CEMETERY COMMITTEE

Now that we can start seeing bare ground plans are being made to finish the work at the Straw Cemetery that was started last fall. A second coat of paint will be put on the maintenance shed, the shutters will be replaced, and the newly painted sign reinstalled.

When the ground is dry enough the older section of the cemetery will have much needed straightening and supporting of many of the gravestones. Along with that, quite a few of the stones will be professionally washed. As is done every year all the American flags at the burial sites of veterans will be replaced in all four cemeteries in town.
